SPECIAL PRESENTATIONS

Hamilton County Public Health - Update on Newtown Landfills

A presentation titled "Construction and Demolition Debris Landfills was given by Greg Kesterman, Assistant Health Commissioner and Chuck DeJonckheere, Director of Waste Management Division of Hamilton County Public Health. The Village of Newtown is the home for two landfills: Newtown Landfill and Burger Environmental, located on SR32. A total of \$198,834 has been paid to the Village of Newtown for Host Fee's (tipping fees) from 2005-2018. Operators for both sites were present at a recent Operator Certification training, held by Hamilton County Public Health. These landfills accept only construction and demolition debris, which is different from garbage in that there is no putrescrible waste, only structural components of buildings.

Burger Environmental's Final Cap Elevation is 578 feet, the western portion is currently capped at 570 feet. Newtown Landfill's approved height for Final Cap Elevation is 596 feet; 2018 survey showed grades of 576+ feet, leaving approximately 16-18 feet more to reach peak height of waste in a narrow band across the top.

Hamilton County Public Health monitors Lake Barber annually for volatile organic compounds (VOC's), which have a molecular make-up containing carbon and chemical properties.
