1. McCullough's Run (21007)

- BCI met with Don Carroll on 08/09/2021 to review a third option. It has access opposite Village Drive.

Moundview Park (20078)

- Soil absorption test was completed on 06/30/21. Upper grass area did not test well. BCI and Village are coordinating to excavate test holes.

MAYOR KOBASUK'S REPORT

ATFD Contract: Contract with ATFD for 2022-2024 fire protection and EMS coverage is expected to be presented at the next council meeting.

<u>Duke Energy License</u>: A revised license agreement from Duke for the walking/bicycle path between Lake Barber and Round Bottom Road will be presented later in the meeting.

Short Park Grant: The field needs to be approved – we don't want to lose the \$50,000 grant for parks.

COUNCIL REPORTS

Employee Total Compensation Package (Terry Fairley)

At the recommendation of Mr. Carroll, Mr. Fairley presented a Total Compensation Package that represents a comprehensive way for employees to look at their individual pay and benefits provided by the Village of Newtown. Mr. Fairley thanked Ms. Everett for putting the numbers together.

Mr. Fairley made a motion to accept the Total Compensation Package for every employee. Mr. Carroll seconded the motion. All Aye. Motion Carried.

HR Committee Meeting: The HR Committee will decide on a date to meet to discuss policies and salary compensation.

<u>TIRC</u>: Mr. Tiettmeyer attended the 07/09/2021 TIRC Board Meeting at Hamilton County Development Corporation. The Board has asked local legislative bodies to approve the TIRC recommendations for current active tax incentives.

Mr. Tiettmeyer made a motion to approve the TIRC Recommendations presented to Council. Mr. Fairley seconded the motion. All Aye. Motion Carried.

Salt Award with Hamilton County

Mr. Short made a motion to comply with Hamilton County's timeline purchasing salt for the upcoming year. Amount of salt to be purchased is 330 tons at \$67.52 per ton. Mr. Zornes seconded the motion. All Aye. Motion Carried. Solicitor Supinger will provide a resolution for the next council meeting.)

Short Park Gazebo Roof Repair

Ms. Williams made a motion to approve \$4,613.67 to Kanga Roof for roof repair of the gazebo at Short Park. Mr. Short seconded the motion. All Aye. Motion Carried.

Short Park Revitalization Budget Update

Mr. Tiettmeyer presented the Short Park Revitalization Budget Update, prepared by Ms. Everett. With all of the projects committed to by the Village, a \$32,988.91 deficit may be realized. This deficit would be covered by a surplus from Moundview Park and the Lake Barber Duke Energy easement funds.

Planning Commission Update

Mr. Carroll attended the July 22nd Planning Commission meeting where two cases were considered and approved. Case 1: 6767 Main Street. The applicant is requesting a Conditional Use approval for the sale of fire arms. The property is zoned PVC (Planned Village Center). Case 2: 3616 Church Main Street. The applicant is explained the request a lot split and lot combination for the purpose of creating a new campus headquarters for the Motz Corporation. The property is zoned ORP (Office Research Park).

<u>Village Solicitor's Report</u> (Solicitor Supinger)

Kinney Soccer Brief

The soccer appeal has been fully briefed by the courts – we are waiting on notification from the court the of oral argument.

Class Action Lawsuit - Opioid Manufacturers

Solicitor Supinger informed Council that the Village of Newtown participated in class action lawsuit against manufacturers of opioids. \$906,000 million dollars will be distributed in the state of Ohio. Distribution of funds will be based on the impact municipalities realized. At the time, the amount we could receive is unclear.

LEGISLATION

Ordinance Approving Zone Change

On May 27, 2021, the Village of Newtown Planning Commission held a public hearing to consider the application of Linda Schulz, as attorney in fact for the owner Lois Powell, the current owner of 6620, 6622 and 6624 Main Street, more particularly described as Hamilton County Parcel Nos. 501-0006-0044-00, 501-0006-0045-00, and 501-0006-0046-00 (the "Property"), for a proposed amendment to the zoning map of the Village of Newtown.

The zone change is for the Property from Residential Two-Family (R-2) to Planned Village Center (PVC).

A Public Hearing was held on July 13, 2021, after properly notifying surrounding property owners.

Mr. Carroll made a motion to adopt <u>ORDINANCE NO. 12-2021</u> AN ORDINANCE APPROVING A ZONE CHANGE FOR PROPERTY LOCATED AT 6620, 6621 AND 6624 MAIN STREET IN THE VILLAGE OF NEWTOWN. Ms. Williams seconded the motion.

Mr. Carroll said Planning Commission heard from residents that were in favor of the zone change and some that opposed. He said it makes sense to approve the above which allows owners to move forward.

It will be necessary to install emergency equipment in the vehicles for police operations and properly mark the vehicles with graphics for identification purposes. Install of the equipment will be \$26,000 to Mobilcomm and vehicle graphics for a total of \$600.00.

Ordinance, American Rescue Plan Act of 2021

The American Rescue Plan Act of 2021 ("ARP"), a \$1.9 trillion economic COVID-19 stimulus package, was signed into law on March 11, 2021. This provides additional relief to address the continued impact of COVID-19 on the economy, public health, state and local governments, individuals and businesses. As part of the ARP stimulus package, \$350 billion in additional funding is being provided to state and local governments, including the Village of Newtown. In order to receive funds from the ARP, the Village of Newtown must establish a fund within the Village budget to properly account for ARP monies received and expended by the Village.
