Mr. Fairley made a motion to approve the 8.10.2021 Council Minutes, motion was seconded by Mr. Short. All Aye. Motion Carried.

SPECIAL PRESENTATIONS

Engineering Update – Bruce Brandstetter

September 10, 2021

Church Street North Paving (20045)

Scheduled to start September 22nd, possibly a day earlier. Starting with catch basin and curb repairs.

Moundview Park (20078)

- Soil absorption test was completed on 6/30/21. Upper grass area did not test well. BCI and Village are coordinating to excavate test holes.
- Lower turf area north of the ball field is a possible option.

Short Park Improvements, Phase I – Trail Improvements (21041)

- Construction started September 7, 2021. Completion expected on September 13, 2021.
- Work includes the connection to the Little Miami Trail and relocate trail for the soccer field. This is as per council approval on 8/10/21.

Short Park Parking Lot (21064)

Complete design to bid the project in 1st quarter of 2022. Consider bundling it with Lake Barber Trail Connector and Municipal Parking

Short Park New Soccer Field (21065)

- Preconstruction meeting scheduled for September 15th at 1:30.
- Hamilton County has agreed to move completion date to 10/15/21.

McCullough's Run (20119)

- Alternative 5- Grade and landscape for a permanent access point opposite Village Drive.
 - Items of note:
 - Requires right of entries from 13 property owners.
 - May require protection around several trees.
 - Will allow periodic maintenance for the culvert to the pedestrian bridge.
 - Schedule
 - * BCI to fine tune the estimate, \$55,000-\$90,000
 - * Concept approval 9/14/21
 - * Right of entries September-October (Mayor Kobasuk will reach out to HOA President)
 - * Complete bid documents October
 - * Bidding November
 - * Construction December-March
 - * Closeout April
 - Allows access to existing stone wall for grouting and repairs and storm outfall from Oyster Bay Court as well as additional rip rap in the future.
 - Handout sheet from McCullough's Run, 8/16/21 is attached.

Lake Barber Trail Connector (21090)

- Draft plans reviewed on 8/16/21.
- Plans have been forwarded to Duke for their approval of alignment.
- May want to bid with the Short Park Parking Lot and the Municipal Parking Lot.

8. <u>Little Dry Run Road Speed Study and Traffic Cal</u>ming (21007)

Proposal as reviewed on 8/16/21 is attached.

Chief Synan said perception is not what is happening concerning speeders. He is leaning towards traffic calming as it is significant in reducing the issue, not waiting on traffic study, doesn't think state will approve lowering the speed limit on Little Dry Run.

11. Turpin Lane Drainage

- Ultimate solution to involve Hamilton County, USACOE, Anderson Township and possibly ODOT to clean the ditch line.
- A flap valve being reinstalled in a catch basin in the drainage swale on the east side of Turpin Lane is an alternative solution.

Short Park Trail - Berm Repair

Council was previously presented with three quotes; Evans was the lowest bid. There is a steep drop off on both sides of the walking path that were not expected. After much discussion,

Mr. Short made a motion to approve \$21,850 Evans to repair the berm on both sides of the walking trail at Short Park. Mr. Fairley seconded the motion.

Mr. Tiettmeyer said he would vote No as he would wait on Westside Paving to be contacted again.

Mr. Short amended the motion; amount not to exceed \$22,000, giving Mayor Kobasuk discretion to approve lowest bidder. Mr. Fairley seconded the motion. Vote: Mr. Short-Yes, Mr. Fairley-Yes, Mr. Zornes-No, Ms. Williams-No, Mr. Tiettmeyer-No. Motion Failed.

PUBLIC COMMENTS

Resident Paul Frede asked Council to look into property to the left of Wessling's wood shop on Main Street – the sidewalk is uneven and the fence is an eyesore.

Tracy Hueber asked if drive-byes are being done as there are a few issues in her neighborhood. Mayor Kobasuk said Mr. Stoker handles property maintenance issues for the Village and follows the Property Maintenance Code.

Resident Peg Quallen asked that the person on Church Street be notified that their garbage cans need to be taken off the street after Rumpke picks up the garbage.

MAYOR AND COUNCIL MEMBER REPORTS:

Medical Plan 1/1/2022 Renewal for Employees

Mr. Fairley is working with Paul Conroy – it is time to start the process of underwriting of medical benefits for employees. Employees were issued the FormFire survey for Employee Health Benefits. Mr. Fairley will report back to Council once process has been completed.

Short Park Revitalization

Mayor Kobasuk received a text from Lawn Management tonight with an amount of \$6,800 to install an irrigation system at Short Park. They are working with Motz Turf coordinating with the timeline of field installation. \$30,000 was budgeted for the irrigation system. Mr. Kobasuk will check to make sure the irrigation system is commercial grade.

Mr. Tiettmeyer made a motion to approve an amount not to exceed \$8,600 for the irrigation system installation by Lawn Management. Mr. Zornes seconded the motion. All Aye. Motion Carried.

Petition to Vacate Paper Street

Residents Bill and Nancy DeVore have filed a petition to vacate the paper street at Plum. A Public Hearing will be held and brought to Council. They have been advised they will be responsible for the survey costs.

Fire Protection w/Anderson Township

January 1, 2016, the Village of Newtown entered into a three (3) year Agreement for the Provision of Fire Protection and Emergency Medical Services to the Village of Newtown. August 14, 2018, Village Council authorized the renewal of the Agreement for an additional three (3) year term, ending December 31, 2021. This renewal is for an additional three-year term commencing on January 1, 2022, ending on December 31, 2024. (Third Renewal Term)

Right of Way Dedication Plat - Roadway to be Named

Planning Commission met and approved the dedication plat on July 22, 2021.

This allows the Fiscal Officer to increase the Fund 2907 Fire Fund from \$660,000 to \$675,000.

Oct. 23rd will be 60 days from the agreement.
